



Meteor Showers

Northern Taurids Peak Night Nov. 10 to 11, 2018

The moon will be 18% of full.

Active from October 19th to December 10th, 2018

This shower is much like the Southern Taurids, just active a bit later in the year. When the two showers are active simultaneously in late October and early November, there is sometimes an notable increase in the fireball activity.

Southern Taurids

Active from September 23rd to November 19th Peak Night October 28 -29

The Southern Taurids are a long-lasting shower with several minor peaks in October and November. The shower is active for two months but rarely produces more than five shower members per hour, even at maximum activity. The Taurids (both branches) are most notable for colorful fireballs and are often responsible for an increased number of fireball reports from September through November.

Fernandina Beach, Florida

TRIP: Amelia Island sharks' teeth are sourced from the dredging of nearby channels to the north and west (and reportedly date back to a 20-million-year-old geological deposit). The island receives sand from this dredging which is pumped back onto the beach in re-nourishment efforts that take place every several years. The last beach re-nourishment was completed in March 2018.

COLLECTING: Shark teeth and other treasures from the sea. When we start, there will be an incoming tide (low 7:53 am – high 2:15 pm).

BRING: The only tools you actually need are your eyes and patience and something in which you can store your finds. For serious hunters a trowel or small shovel and a screen can be helpful.

REQUIREMENTS: This is a public beach so no special requirements. Dress for a December day at the beach (checking the weather forecast in advance is advisable).

PETS (Yes): Dogs are allowed on the beach but must be leashed. Also, please clean up after your dog.

OTHER INFORMATION: We will be in the historic town of Fernandina Beach which offers a wide range of lodging and dining.

DIRECTIONS AND WHERE TO MEET:

From I-95 take exit 373 for FL-200/FL-A1A toward Callahan/Fernandina Beach.

Turn right onto State Hwy 108/Sadler Rd.

At the traffic circle, take the 3rd exit onto Florida A1A N/S Fletcher Ave.

Continue on S. Fletcher Ave. past the Seaside Amelia Inn and through the intersection with Atlantic Ave.

We will meet in the very back of the parking lot (north end).

Swag & Tassel: The Innovative Stoneware of Thomas Chandler through July 20th, 2019, 2nd Floor, South Gallery

Swag & Tassel: The Innovative Stoneware of Thomas Chandler, is the first retrospective exhibition of a 19th century Edgefield, SC, potter since I Made This Jar: The Life and Works of the Enslaved African-American Potter, Dave. Building upon the research in Philip Wingard's 2014 Ceramics in America article, "From Baltimore to the South Carolina Backcountry: Thomas Chandler's Influence on 19th Century Stoneware," the exhibition brings archaeological and archival research to bear on our understanding of the nature and scope of Chandler's technical and aesthetic innovations within the context of mid-19th century Edgefield District pottery manufacturing.

Place It/Face It: Pottery by Eugene through December 15th 2018, 2nd Floor, North Gallery

Place It/Face It: Pottery by Eugene is the first retrospective exhibition of ceramic art by self-taught African-American potters Winton and Rosa Eugene of Cowpens, SC. For thirty years, this husband and wife artistic team has produced a body of functional wares that speak to southerners' shared experience of place and sculptural works that seek to address issues of particular concern to them. The exhibit will survey both the wheel-turned, painted plates and pitchers that Winton creates to document the vernacular architecture, flora and fauna of the south, as well as the series of sculptural works Rosa hand coils—Minority in Relief, The Struggle, and Beauty to name a few
